Growing a sustainable future

Creating an Indigenous food lab and cultural workspace on campus

In partnership with local tribes, the Native American Studies department is raising funds to create a groundbreaking Food Sovereignty Lab and Cultural Workspace at Humboldt State. The Lab will operate as a commercial kitchen, with a plant drying station and salmon pit for preparing food, baskets, and regalia. Donors like the Batt Ingram family have pledged \$60,000 to support Indigenous knowledge and equity through the Food Lab, which is slated to open Fall 2022.
